

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Macbeth is about the power of promises as much as it is about magical prophecies. While the predictions made by those weird sisters that "look not like the inhabitants o' the earth" are taken as signs of a preordained destiny. The promises made between Macbeth and Lady Macbeth bond these characters to terrible courses of actions with a similar force, despite all reason, consequence, and compassion suggesting to both it might be best if they break their covenant. Macbeth cautions us against belief in fate—fooling ourselves that our fortunes are beyond our control.

In staging this play, I looked to comic books for inspiration. Comic books' emphasis on simultaneous action, destiny, super humans, and the supernatural seem to parallel the epic proportions and otherworldliness of Macbeth. Comics also imagine worlds different from our own, featuring their own rituals, technologies, beliefs, hierarchies, and styles of dress. We have tried to realize a distinct world for Macbeth; a world in which sculptural dress denotes rank, where men and women participate equally in unsparing gamesmanship and brutal agility on the battlefield and in the political arena, and where lemons—a sweet, sour, and stinging fruit—symbolize both great power and death. It is also a world in which shape-shifting witches play games with humans, tempting them but never forcing their actions.

The creation of this world was only possible through the imaginations and tireless efforts of the designers, the fight directors, the dramaturg, stage management, and the cast and crew. Most nights we were all together in the rehearsal hall working scene by scene coordinating media with properties with characterization with costumes with music to create a fully integrated production. It has been a great pleasure to work with such a dynamic group of artists.

DRAMATURG'S NOTE

When I was told Ann was going to direct a comic-book Macbeth, I was wary of what the setting might do to the seriousness of the play. After our first meeting she explained that she wanted to use thematic elements of a comic book, rather than put the characters literally inside one and I began to see the brilliance behind it. Usually, with Shakespeare's plays, all of the action happens off stage, but by using the comic book element of simultaneous action, we can see the violence as it is described, which effectively makes this world more monstrous. The comic book also lets the play be set in a world different from our own, one where anything is possible. When anything can happen, monsters can emerge from people fairly easily, especially when they believe they are owed something. Macbeth and Lady Macbeth are prime examples of what can happen when people become obsessed with power. For Lady Macbeth, who is commonly villainous, we see her walk a path full of guilt and regret that ultimately leads to her end. We see Macbeth transform from glorified warrior to bully to horrific tyrant. After watching Macbeth, I hope it is clear to you why thespians and theatre goers alike are afraid to whisper "Macbeth."




